1. Follow our socials – we are constantly awareness raising.

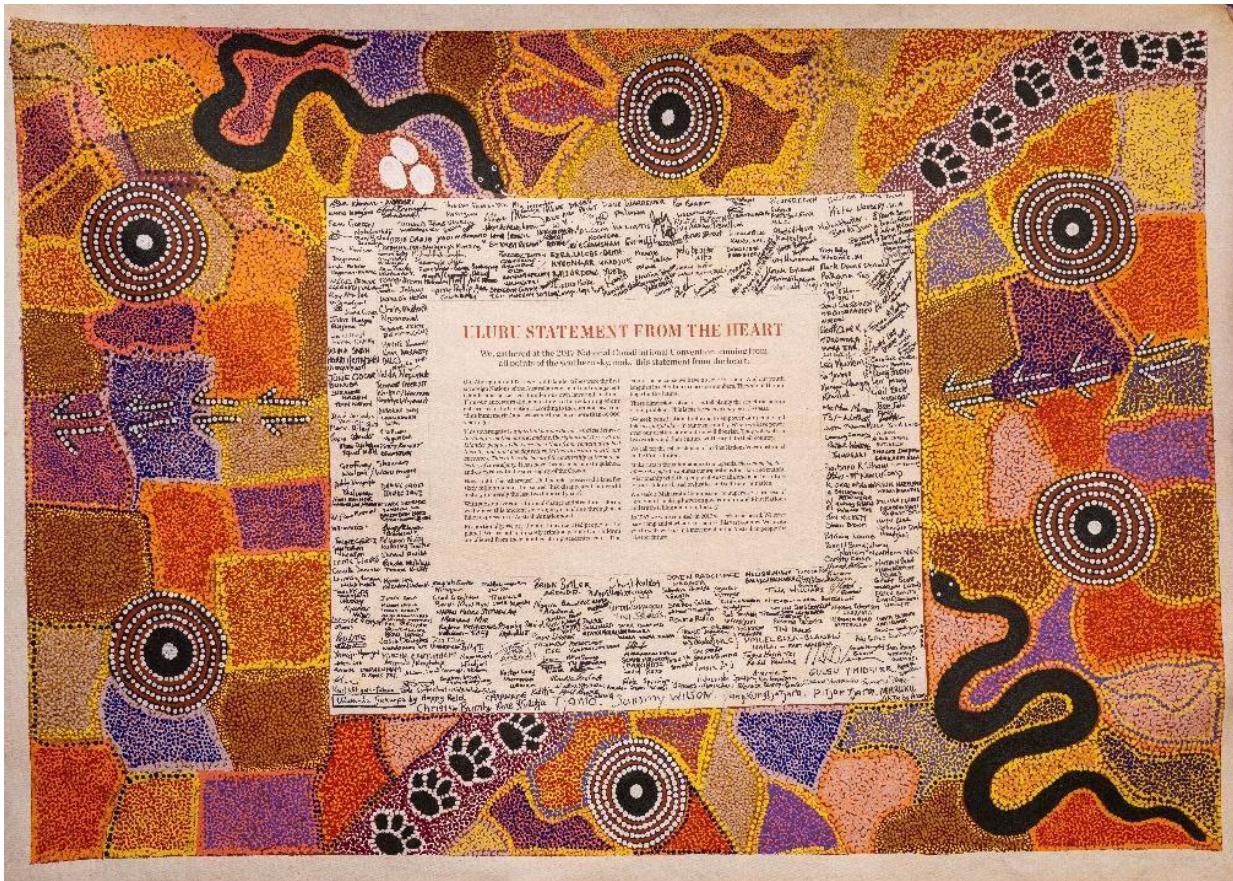
